Wednesday, underlining that any distinction made between a natural mother, a biological mother, and a surrogate mother is an "insult" to motherhood. The court was hearing a plea by a surrogate mother, who gave birth to twins and whose maternity leave application the Rajasthan government denied, arguing that the Rajasthan Service Rules, 1951, did not provide for maternity leave for women who have children through surrogacy. "A mother cannot be discriminated against because she is a surrogate mother," the court said.

"Right to life under Article 21 of the Constitution... includes the right to motherhood and also the right of every child to full development. If the government can provide maternity leave to an adoptive mother, it is difficult to digest the refusal on the part of the Government to provide maternity leave to a mother who begets a child through the surrogacy procedure," added the court.

The court, in its order, also said that "no distinction can be made by the state government to a natural mother, a biological mother and a mother who has begotten a child through surrogacy method."

BSF jawan shoots self with service rifle: Cops

BARMER: A Border Security Force (BSF) jawan allegedly shot himself with his service rifle while on duty along the Pakistan border in Rajasthan's Barmer district, on Thursday morning, police said. The 24-year-old jawan was a resident of Tripura and posted in BSF's 83 battalion. Till the filing of the report, police were clueless about the reason behind the extreme step. A police official of the Barmer police station said the jawan shot himself at around 8.00 am with his service rifle. "At the time of the incident he

was on his duty. Hearing the sound of the fire, soldiers rushed there and found the jawan in a pool of blood. He was taken to the district hospital where doctors declared him dead," the police official said. "Later higher officials of the BSF and police were informed." The police official said that family members of the deceased have been informed and after conducting the postmortem the body will be handed over to them. "BSF has launched a probe into the matter," he said.
